

LANDLORD/TENANT ISSUES



Renting a living space is something that almost everyone will do at some point in their life. In most cases, your rental experience will come without incident, but in case it does here is who you should contact regarding landlord/tenant issues.

DISCRIMINATION

Federal and state laws prohibit discrimination based on race, color, national origin, religion, sex, family status, marital status, financial status, or disability. In addition, it is a violation of state law to be discriminated on the basis of age (40 or older), marital status or status with respect to public assistance.
